STALL RESERVATION INSTRUCTIONS

Stall Reservation Deadline: Stall reservation forms must be received by NBR by as soon as possible. Please Note: there are a limited number of stalls available. Get your requests in ASAP. Please fill out "stall reservation" section on the NaturalBornRacers Entry Form.

Stabling Fees: The stabling fee is stalls \$15 (pipe corral pens).

Definition of a "night" of stabling: each stall may be occupied only for the nights for which a reservation is made and paid/owed. A "night" is defined as a "24-hour period of time." The 24-hour period will commence upon check in.

Stabling Together: We will try to accommodate requests from owners expressing an interest in stabling together, but we cannot guarantee specific stabling arrangements.

NO Horses in Trailers Over Night or Tied to Trailers: Under no circumstances may a horse be left in a trailer or tied to a trailer overnight.

Arrival & Check In: Horse owners may begin checking in to receive their stall assignments at the ranch at 12:00 pm on Friday, and 8:00 am each morning thereafter. Please be sure to indicate your arrival time on your Entry Form under Stall Reservation Fee.

Each horse owner or owner's agent who brings a horse to Cameron Ranch must complete and submit:

MUST ACCOMPANY ENTRY

COWBOY CHALLENGE RULES & JUDGING

1. The Cowboy Race will be a timed event during which the performance of each horse and rider team will be judged on each obstacle for quality of horsemanship. For each obstacle, the judge will award performance points on a scale of 0-10 based on the horse's attitude, the rider's horsemanship, and the team's overall performance. An average score is 5.5
2. Contestants may be required to complete each obstacle within 30 seconds in order to receive points for the obstacle. If an obstacle is not completed within 30 seconds, the contestant will be flagged/whistled and must move on to the next obstacle.
3. Each contestant must complete the entire course within a specified amount of time (to be determined based on the number of obstacles in the course). Any contestant who fails to meet this time limit will be disqualified.
4. Any contestant who falls off his/her horse or is separated from their horse (ground tie) will have 1 minute to catch their horse. If the horse leaves the course the rider will be disqualified, will not be permitted to remount, and will be excused from the arena.
5. It is the responsibility of the contestant to understand the rules of the competition before the race begins. Contestants will be permitted to ask questions about the rules up until the first contestant enters the course. Questions should be directed to the Event Manager and/or Judge.
 - ☞ 6. The crowd at the event is considered part of the course, and each contestant acknowledges that the crowd may be a distraction to his/her horse.
 - ☞ 7. At the judge's discretion a contestant may be issued a re-ride should an outside distraction from beyond the course (such as a fire alarm going off, a medical emergency, etc.) be so great as to inhibit the contestant from having a fair opportunity to compete. If a contestant wants to request a re-ride, he/she must request a re-ride within two minutes of (a) the ride being stopped at the discretion of the judge or competition management, or (b) the rider completing the course and receiving a time. If a re-ride is issued, the contestant will receive the re-ride at the end of the qualifying rides on the same day.
8. Each contestant must make an effort to complete each obstacle in the course; if an obstacle is skipped, a zero score is given and 30 seconds added to their overall time. Should a contestant veer off course and miss an obstacle, he/she may go back and complete the obstacle before moving on to the next obstacle. Neither the judge, nor anyone on the competition crew will alert the contestant that an obstacle has been missed.
9. Contestants may utilize any western tack or equipment that is considered standard in the industry and in recognized competitions. Any bit, spur, or other piece of equipment deemed severe or inappropriate by the judge will not be allowed. The judge will evaluate the tack on the horse when it enters the arena. Mechanical hackamores, nosebands, and tie downs will not be permitted. For their safety, riders are encouraged to wear approved riding helmets. Horses are permitted to wear protective leg wraps, boots, or other leg gear.

MUST ACCOMPANY RACE ENTRY COWBOY RACE RULES & JUDGING (continued)

10. Contestants should be outfitted in proper western attire. This includes but is not limited to a long sleeve shirt with collar, a western hat or riding helmet, and boots. Tennis shoes, billed caps, tee shirts, shorts, etc. are not permitted.
11. All contestants will compete in the order in which their names are drawn or in order of entry paperwork received; failure to compete in this order will result in disqualification.
12. Contestants may not change horses for any reason in the qualifying round or Finals. If a contestant's horse is injured after the qualifying round and before the Finals, the contestant must withdraw from the competition.
13. Any dispute or complaint by a contestant must be brought to the attention of the official timer prior to the contestant leaving the course arena. All contestants agree to abide by the rulings of the judge; the decisions of the judge will be final and not subject to appeal for any reason.
14. The judge and/or the management of NaturalBornRacers may disqualify a contestant for abuse of any animal or violation of any contest rule. No drugs may be administered to any contestant's horse to enhance the horse's ability to navigate the course. The administration of drugs (other than those prescribed by a veterinarian for treatment of a specific condition) will be grounds for disqualification.
15. The ride time calculated by the official timer for the competition will be deemed the official time for each contestant's ride and may not be challenged by any contestant. There may also be a back-up timer. Should the primary fail, the back-up time will be made the official time. The timer's records are final and may not be challenged in any way by the contestant. Should all timers fail, the contestant will receive a re-ride at the end of all competitors for that day.
16. A. Time Bonus Points: Bonus points are calculated by the software program or a manual spread determined by the Judge and determined by number of entries per division.
17. In the event of a tie for first, there will be a run off.

I have read the Cowboy Race Rules listed above and agree to comply with these Rules. I understand that if I fail to comply with these Rules, the judge and/or the staff of NaturalBornRacers may withdraw me from the Cowboy Race and I will forfeit all entry fees.

ROSAMOND HISTORY

Rosamond was officially established in 1877, and was named after the daughter of an official of the Southern Pacific Railroad, the town site owner. An application for a Post Office was filed on May 2, 1855, with David Bayles appointed the first Postmaster, serving 100 people. The old Post Office building is now located at the Tropico Gold Mine site.

Mining and cattle were prime industries in the early days. In the late 1890's, the Lida Mine (later Tropico Mine) opened. When pay dirt was struck several years later, the hills swarmed with miners. Assays on the ore went as high as \$100,000 per ton. In the 1930's, when mining again boomed, and the Army Air Corps established Muroc Army Air Field (now Edwards AFB), the community was able to add street lights and a water plant. Local attractions: International Willow Springs Raceway, Exotic Cat Feline Sanctuary. Barbara Mandrell's hometown is Rosamond. John Wayne's hometown is Lancaster (our neighboring sister city). Our local Edwards AFB broke the first sound barrier.

Cameron Ranch is a resort like getaway in a modest western setting. Originally established 50 years ago in the Newhall area with a full size Movie Western Town. It was relocated to Rosamond in 1981. A small miniature Western Town was built by Denzel Cameron to keep with the Cameron Ranch tradition. Denzel Cameron is remembered in the annual Memorial Denzel Cameron Ride & Drive which stops at Cameron Ranch to celebrate his life. Cameron Ranch is sprinkled with Denzel's memories. You will see antique buildings and livestock equipment throughout the property. Bill is a fifth-generation Cameron carrying on with the Cameron Legacy by continuing the family tradition.
